

Siesta Hills Neighborhood Association Meeting

November 14, 2019

The meeting was called to order by president Rachel Baca at 7 pm.

Guests, board members and residents were welcomed.

Board members present were Rachel Baca, Kathy Pierson, Francie Straw, Dan Puccetti, Don Conley, Lydia Rigg and Archie Archuleta.

Francie Straw read the minutes from the August 15 , 2019 meeting, and they were approved.

Don Conley reported that we have \$3415.23 in the checking account. The board voted to reimburse Francie Straw \$ 87.82 and Kathy Pierson son \$16.45 for expenses incurred for the annual picnic.

.Archie Archuleta will contact the city about locking and unlocking the gates at Bullhead Park. There will be a January meeting with the city about park security.

The beautification committee continues to maintain the entrance with watering and pruning. 311 was contacted about the mess at the entry way, and it was cleared up.

Pete Stromberg attended the recent the bulk fuel spill meeting and reported that the plumes have diminished considerably except for the plume at Ridgecrest Drive and Ridgecrest Place. Phase II in two years is scheduled to address this issue. However, the board feels that more immediate action is needed. Don Conley will contact Kathryn Lynnes and Scott Clark from Kirtland AFB to see if action can be expedited. There is adequate funding.

Pete Stromberg also addressed the issue of fly overs. He reported that the situation has improved except for the UPS planes at 3am and 5 am.

Tessa Snyder from Highland High School addressed the issue of community involvement in identifying student needs and locating appropriate resources.

Lydia Rigg reported that 12 households participated in the yard sale. She will also welcome new residents to Siesta Hills with a welcoming letter, roster, by-laws, covenants and a treat. Residents are encouraged to contact her when new residents move into our neighborhood.

Trent Tyler reported that new lighting has been installed at Lasseter Park and that the park is now very well illuminated. Don Conley stated that \$660 had been previously approved for improved security measures that could be used to illuminate houses bordering the park.

The Sahara Motel continues to be of concern. Pete Stromberg will contact Jose Brionez, crime specialist from APD, about these issues.

Pete Stromberg has updated the Siesta Hills website. Names of dues paying members will be listed.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:45 . Our next meeting will be February 13, 2020.
